A Penny Saved Is a Lesson Learned: Helping Your Kids Set Up a Budget

Kids these days. They take in money faster than we do, proportionately. Grandma's birthday money, lemonade-stand proceeds, babysitting and lawn-mowing earnings, allowance—their revenue streams are plentiful. Now's the time to introduce good financial management strategies.

Consider helping your kids set up varied funds with their money. Provide piggy banks or envelopes or decorated glass jars, labeled with names the kids can understand. Even young kids can grasp concepts like "little money," "big money," and "sharing money."

"Little money" is for spending. The child can dip into this fund anytime for a small purchase like candy or a comic book. In doing so, your young one will learn the value of various bills and coins, and even about tax.

"Big money" is savings for something specific: an American Girl doll, a video game, a bike, a trip to camp. You might want to help your child open an actual savings account at a bank for this fund.

"Sharing money" is set aside to give away. This is the money your child places in the church offering or gives to a charitable cause. Your child might enjoy dropping coins into a Salvation Army kettle, or buying toys for a refugee family.

You and your kids may come up with more or different categories. That's fine. What matters is that they'll learn basic budgeting and some math concepts, they'll become prepared to live debtfree as adults, and they'll develop character qualities like goal setting, discipline, delayed gratification, problem solving and generosity. It's an activity you can share together.


And that's the most important bottom line of all.

> white water rafting, or test their skills at one of 50 remarkable golf courses in the region.



Don't Let Blood Pressure Stress You Out


High blood pressure can be caused by factors beyond your control, like heredity and the food you ate as a child. But it can also be caused by controllable factors, like stress and diet. The good news is that most people can lower and control their blood pressure by applying some commonsense principles.

- Hit the salad bar diets heavy in fruit and vegetables provide you with good amounts of vitamin C and E, which can decrease blood pressure.
- Let it roll aerobic exercise (walking, jogging, biking) tends to lower blood pressure; anaerobic exercise (weight lifting) doesn't have the same positive effect.
 - Lose a few taking off just a few pounds aids in reducing blood pressure.
- Have an orange folic acid (found in citrus fruits, leafy green vegetables and beans) tends to reduce the risk of high blood pressure.
- Nurse your baby studies continue to show the many benefits of mother's milk for newborns; among them, decreased chance of high blood pressure in adulthood.



Here's some good news: hardwood forests are growing faster than they're being cut down in the U.S.

Still, for peace of mind, look for the Forest Stewardship Council (FSC) stamp of approval on any hardwood you buy. The FSC certifies that your floor was produced using environmentally responsible forestry practices.

An alternative to hardwood is called reclaimed flooring. It's made of wood salvaged from buildings, river bottoms, or old floors. Or consider bamboo or cork; both are readily renewable and improve the

renewable and improve the ambiance of any room.



Delicious Ham and Potato Soup

3 1/2 cups peeled and diced potatoes 1/3 cup diced celery 1/3 cup finely chopped onion

3/4 cup diced cooked ham 3 1/4 cups water

2 tablespoons chicken bouillon granules

1/2 teaspoon salt, or to taste

1 teaspoon ground white or black pepper, or to taste

5 tablespoons butter

5 tablespoons flour 2 cups milk

Combine the potatoes, celery, onion, ham and water in a stockpot. Bring to a boil, then cook over medium heat until potatoes are tender, about 10 to 15 minutes. Stir in the chicken bouillon, salt and pepper. In a separate saucepan, melt butter over medium-low heat. Whisk in flour with a fork, and cook, stirring constantly until thick, about 1 minute. Slowly stir in milk so as not to allow lumps to form, until all of the milk has been added. Continue stirring over medium-low heat until thick, 4 to 5 minutes. Stir the milk mixture into the stockpot, and cook soup until heated through. Serve immediately.
